## PARTICIPANT ELIGIBILITY CRITERA

Participants must meet the minimum criteria stated below to enrol in any of our courses on offer.

- Participants must be a minimum of 18 years of age.
- Where applicable, participants must have successfully completed required training within the last 2 years.
- All courses are delivered in English. It is a requirement that participants attend with appropriate language, literacy and numeracy skills necessary to complete the course. Where there is doubt as to the language, literacy and numeracy skills of a participant, pretesting may be required to ensure the minimum required standard is met prior to enrolment.
- You must notify us of any disabilities or other special requirements so we can ensure that the course is suited to your needs.

- Payment must be received prior to the commencement of training.

## **BASIC GAMING TRAINING**

Recognised by Consumer and Business Services

## **DURATION**

This course is delivered over 2 x 7.5 hour days.

## WHAT DOES THE TRAINING COVER?

This course also includes nationally accredited units:



- SITHGAM022 Provide Responsible Gambling Services
- SITHGAM023 Attend Gaming Machines

This course will give the participant the required skills and knowledge to

- Provide responsible gambling services
- Provide information and assistance to customers about problem gambling
- Identify and report on indicators of problem gambling including automated risk monitoring
- Explain and understand pre-commitment principles
- Implement gaming barring arrangements and resolve barring breaches
- Respond usefully to approaches for help regarding a gambling problem
- Identify regulatory and procedural requirements from source documentation
- Advise customers on gaming activities
- Operate and maintain gaming machines
- Monitor security of gaming areas
- Make gaming machine payouts
- Operate and maintain coin dispensing equipment

## WHO NEEDS TO UNDERTAKE THE TRAINING?

All persons appointed as a Gaming Manager or Gaming Employee in South Australia must complete Basic Gaming Training within 3 months of approval to comply with legislative requirements in South Australia.

# WHAT ACCREDITATION WILL BE AWARDED?

On successful completion of the course, participants will be awarded a statement of attainment for each of the nationally accredited units and a statement of attendance for Basic Gaming Training which is recognised by Consumer and Business Services, the senior regulator for commercial forms of gambling in South Australia.



## **ADVANCED GAMING TRAINING**

Recognised by Consumer and Business Services Under section 10B(1)(b) of the Gaming Machines Act 1992

#### DURATION

This course is delivered over 1 x 7 hour day.

## WHAT DOES THE TRAINING COVER?

This course will give the participant the required skills and knowledge to:

- Understand and implement prescribed duties, namely the roles and responsibility of a Gaming Manager
- Identify problematic gambling behaviour, review and act upon records made, including responding to automated risk monitoring systems
- Offer low level intervention and referral to gambling help services
- Assist players to implement a pre-commitment limit
- Resolve and determine applications for complex and involuntary barrings and breaches
- Understand and explain services offered by a variety of gambling help services
- Differentiate in practical workplace situations the roles of bodies or officials relevant to regulatory and procedural requirements

## WHO NEEDS TO UNDERTAKE THE TRAINING?

All persons appointed as a gaming manager must complete this course within three months of approval to comply with legislative requirements in South Australia., (Must complete Basic Training before undertaking Advanced Training).

Gaming managers must also repeat this course every two years to remain compliant.

Advanced Training can also be undertaken by gaming employees who are required to repeat Basic Gaming training every two years.

(Note if a gaming employee does not undertake Advanced Training they must repeat Basic training every two years)

# WHAT ACCREDITATION WILL BE AWARDED?

On successful completion of the course, participants will be awarded a statement of attainment for Advanced Gaming Training, which is recognised by The Independent Gambling Authority, the senior regulator for commercial forms of gambling in South Australia under section 10B(1)(b) of the Gaming Machines Act 1992.



## **FURTHER ADVANCED GAMING TRAINING**

Recognised by Consumer and Business Services Under section 10B(1)(b) of the Gaming Machines Act 1992

## **DURATION**

This course is delivered over 1 x 4 hour day.

## WHAT DOES THE TRAINING COVER?

This course will give the participant the required skills and knowledge to:

- Understand and implement prescribed duties, namely the roles and responsibility of a Gaming Manager
- Identify problematic gambling behaviour, review and act upon records made, including responding to automated risk monitoring systems
- Offer low level intervention and referral to gambling help services
- Assist players to implement a pre-commitment limit
- Resolve and determine applications for complex and involuntary barrings and breaches
- Understand and explain services offered by a variety of gambling help services
- Differentiate in practical workplace situations the roles of bodies or officials relevant to regulatory and procedural requirements

## WHO NEEDS TO UNDERTAKE THE TRAINING?

All persons appointed as a gaming manager must complete this course within three months of approval to comply with legislative requirements in South Australia., (Must complete Basic Training before undertaking Advanced Training).

Gaming managers must also repeat this course every two years to remain compliant.

Advanced Training can also be undertaken by gaming employees who are required to repeat Basic Gaming training every two years.

(Note if a gaming employee does not undertake Advanced Training they must repeat Basic training every two years)

# WHAT ACCREDITATION WILL BE AWARDED?

On successful completion of the course, participants will be awarded a statement of attainment for Advanced Gaming Training, which is recognised by The Independent Gambling Authority, the senior regulator for commercial forms of gambling in South Australia under section 10B(1)(b) of the Gaming Machines Act 1992.
